

Dentist Discusses Recent Study Linking Frequent X-Rays, Cancer

STUDIO CITY (CBS) — A recent study published in the journal *Cancer* says radiation from frequent dental X-rays may be linked to an increased risk for non-cancerous brain tumors.

Researchers found that those who get bite-wing X-rays at least once a year or more had a 40 to 90 percent greater risk of a brain tumor but experts point out that these results are based on high radiation levels than patients are exposed to today.
